#### Making and studying History at Bedfield

#### Ash Class (Year 3&4)

Another celebration at Bedfield related to the 76<sup>th</sup> anniversary of The Windrush generation's arrival in the UK in 1948. Ash Class had been studying the contributions made by the many who came to Britain on The Windrush and their descendants, including Floella Benjamin, a current member of the House of Lords, presenter of children's television in the past (many older members of the school community remember her in that capacity!), author of children's literature and leader of many charitable causes.

Children in Ash Class produced fantastic work about the history of The Windrush, a former cruise ship, and many members of the Windrush generation. One child wrote a diary as a child leaving the Caribbean and then living as an adult living in the UK, creating alongside her diary a box of mementos. For Ash Class's commemorative party, the children and their families made many cakes using ingredients from the Caribbean – ginger, cocoa and pineapples as well as drinking fruit juices made from mangoes and coconut. Our school governors were happy to help us finish up the variety of cakes after their meeting at the school that day.
