

The weather was kind and we spent a lovely day walking along the river, spotting wildlife and collecting data about the river. We measured depth, width, temperature and even the flow of the river using a floating dog biscuit, although due to the lack of rain there wasn't much movement! The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the history of the nature reserve and wrote some fantastic reports about the river back at school.


