News from the PFA

It's been a fantastic start back for the PFA.

First of all, I'd like to say a huge heartfelt thank you to Mrs Mitchell and Lucy Webb for all their hard work as Treasurer and Secretary over the past year/s. Your dedication and contributions have been a big part of the PFA's success. As you both step down, we're delighted to welcome some new faces.

A warm welcome to Debra, Anna, Lydia, and Megan as new members and welcome back to Lizzie! Remember, you don't have to attend every meeting to be part of the PFA. We're always looking for volunteers and contributions to support school events in any way you can.

We're also thrilled to share that we recently received an Adnams Grant for £560.18 for new equipment. This came through just before half-term and will be a wonderful benefit for the children.

Unfortunately, the company we usually work with for Christmas cards and gifts has gone into recession, so we won't be able to offer these this year. The good news, however, is that after a bit of research, we've found a new supplier for the tea towels, which means our annual school tea towel tradition will continue! More details on that soon.

I'd also like to take a moment to explain how the PFA supports the school. We're a separate charity, and the school sends us requests for things that will directly benefit the children. Recently, we donated £600 towards transport costs so the children can attend the Christmas Panto.

We've also funded the Hungate Christmas Tree for the town's Light Switch-On, the Art Competition, and a special visit from a zookeeper from Africa Alive, who came in to teach the children about the animals.

Along with this, we are also supporting the school with a bid to fund a new stage for Christmas and other performances.

After our recent AGM, I'm proud to say the PFA currently has its strongest financial position since I joined a few years ago and we've achieved this with just a small but mighty team of members!
