


ALL SAINTS' CE PRIMARY SCHOOL

Year 3 & 4 performance which took us on a journey through the decades of the last 70 years. The programme included iconic music from each decade, key national events and advances in technology, as well as personal moments from the Queen's reign.









INVOLVED

There were many opportunities to get involved during the lead up and during the Jubilee celebrations. Children had the opportunity to decorate a plate or

tile at a local pottery painting studio.







Each class also created some artwork relating to the Jubilee which was displayed at our Jubilee picnic party.



Reception/Ruby class: created a collage of the Queen's profile inspired by stamps.





Year 1/Amber Class: have been busy designing their own crowns on collagraphs. Then they printed them onto the background of red/white/blue.





Year 2/Topaz Class: created a collage of the Queen's crown inspired by the complementary colours used by Henri Matisse's collage called 'The Snail'.





Year 3/Emerald Class: created corgi pictures inspired by Henri Matisse's artwork called 'Jazz, Le Ciel, La Mer'.





Year 4/Sapphire Class: designed and created a shoe for the queen. They made a cast model of a shoe with masking tape and then painted them red/white/blue.



Year 5/Amethyst class: were inspired by Dave Devereux to create some collaborate Art, based on important symbols of monarchs e.g. orb and sceptre.





Year 6/Diamond Class: created press prints inspired by the Queen's side on portraits.





On the last day of term, children came together for a Jubilee picnic and finished the day with a celebration of the children's learning. Each class performed a short piece to the parents which included poems,

songs and short acting, based on the Queen's Jubilee. Parents had

the opportunity to look at the children's amazing artwork and buy some of the lovely cakes from the cake competition.
