


Ringsfield Church of England Primary School

The Reception class had great fun exploring a range of science experiments, some of which were quite hair-raising!



The Year 1 and 2 children enjoined a joint micro-habitats day, with Brampton and Bramfield Primary schools. All of the children worked really hard to create a giant bug hotel in the middle of Stoven Wood.



Year 3 and 4 spent Science Week finding out about bones! They were able to borrow a full-sized human skeleton from Sir John Lemon High School. This helped the children to learn more about how the bones within the human body work. They were also lucky to have a visit from Mr Roslyn from CEFAS. He brought along a selection of animal skulls for the children to examine and compare.



During Science Week, the pupils in Years 5 and 6 were able to deepen their understanding of properties of materials. Their investigations included testing a range to discover which one was the best thermal insulator.



We finished Science Week with a Science Fayre. The children brought in science experiments from home and displayed them in the hall and the Year 3/4 classroom. We were overwhelmed by the children's response and enthusiasm for this event. The majority of the children from Reception to Year 6 took part and brought in a wide variety of science experiments and information, ranging from water filtration to miniature volcanoes!
