Parents were welcomed to an assembly all about it and then completed a range of activities with their children.

This term science has driven the curriculum across the school and the children have learned lots about the solar system, the sun, the planets and the moon. The children loved having a visit from a mobile planetarium, which helped further their knowledge and understanding.

As part of Sport Relief this year, we re-launched the daily mile so all children across the school are now involved. Parents were invited to attend and join in too!
